
Introduction

During this holiday season, when we celebrate hope and new beginnings, we would like to share one significant achievement by Macedonian women.

When we compare Macedonia with other European countries, the nation is often ranked among the worst performers in many economic and social indicators. However, in STEM education, Macedonian women shine as some of the very best in Europe.

Key Findings

In 2021, Macedonia had the highest share of female STEM graduates in Europe, surpassing both highly developed economies such as **Germany (28%)** and **Switzerland (24%)**, as well as regional peers including **Slovenia (32%)** and **Albania (43%)**.



Persistence matters

Macedonian women demonstrate extraordinary persistence: once they enter STEM fields, they are far more likely to complete their studies and graduate successfully. Despite this significant gap in enrollment




MALES PER 1,000
